2023-2024 Year-Round Youth (YRY) Program Request for Program Plan

INTRODUCTION AND OVERVIEW

Connect Detroit is seeking proposals from high-performing, youth-serving organizations to provide services for the successful implementation of the 2023-2024 Year-Round Youth (YRY) Program as it relates to the Workforce Innovation Opportunity Act (WIOA) funding. WIOA funding is designed to support a workforce development program and activities for both in-school (14-21) and out-of-school youth (16-24). Therefore, program activities should relate to workforce preparation, align with the 14 WIOA Program Elements, and result in successful outcomes which is described as a youth exiting the program with a recognized credential <u>and</u> employment, <u>or</u> post-secondary/advanced training enrollment, <u>or</u> military enlistment.

The 2023-2024 Year-Round Youth Program and WIOA funding serves Detroit youth who are in or out-of-school, and WIOA eligible. The Detroit Year-Round Youth Collaborative partners will use trauma-informed, resilience-building, and human-centered design approaches and strategies to help address youth and young adults' education, employment, and training needs. The Detroit Year-Round Youth Collaborative seeks to:

- Connect youth and young adults with the labor market, career pathways, education, and work experiences
- Improve young peoples' outcomes through: a) education and employment; b) attainment of industry-recognized certifications or degrees; c) academic skill and grade advancement; and d) occupational skills related to high-growth, high-demand professional sectors
- Align opportunities and programming to promote collaboration that expands access to training and employment opportunities, reduces wraparound service duplication and gaps to advance equity and amplify Collective Impact
- Offer work-based learning, support services, life skills, and mentoring among other supports and services

PROGRAM PROVISIONS

Year-Round Youth Program Partners will engage in Collective Impact practices, including:

- Developing and refining a shared vision and plan of action
- Collectively using data to: a) inform their collective work; b) strengthen best practices; and c) foster professional development
- Developing collective measures of success
- Expanding individual organizational and collective capacity
- Engaging in open communication and good-faith problem-solving among ourselves, with program participants and their families, and community partners as needed
- Share power and resources, and hold each other accountable
- Maintain equity for Detroit youth as a central value

Additionally, Year-Round Youth Program Partners will:

- Adopt trauma-informed, resilience-building, and human-centered design approaches, philosophies, and strategies to help address youth and young adults' education, employment, and training needs.
- Participate in annual review of performance, as well as continuous quality improvement and evaluation efforts.
